***Internal Assessment (IA):** Theory: From marks scored in sessional examinations,
Practical: From the clinical end of posting examinations.

****Term work** is calculated from seminars, assignments, journal presentations and classroom teaching.

C. Minimum for Pass: The candidate will be declared as 'Pass' in any subject only if he/she obtains a minimum of 50% of the total marks of the subject (aggregate of university examinations and internal assessment), **separately in theory, practical and term work**. A candidate who fails (less than 50%) in any subject (theory, practical, term work or dissertation) shall take the examination only in that subject at a subsequent supplementary examination (both theory and practical) and must obtain the minimum for a pass in that subject as stated earlier.

The candidate has to pass all subjects of I MOT to be eligible to appear for II MOT examinations. The candidates who fails in any subject of I MOT is permitted to attend the II MOT program, and has to successfully complete the subjects in the

supplementary exams, failing which they will not be permitted to appear for the II MOT university examinations

D. GRADING SYSTEM

The grading system is as follows:

Distinction – 75% and above

First Class – 65% and above – below 75%

Second Class – 50% and above – below 65%

Pass – 50%

Fail – Below 50%
